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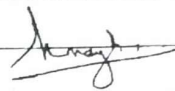
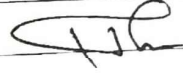
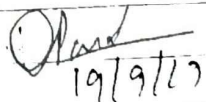

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Report of the Seminar on Research Methodology held on Dated-11.12.2020

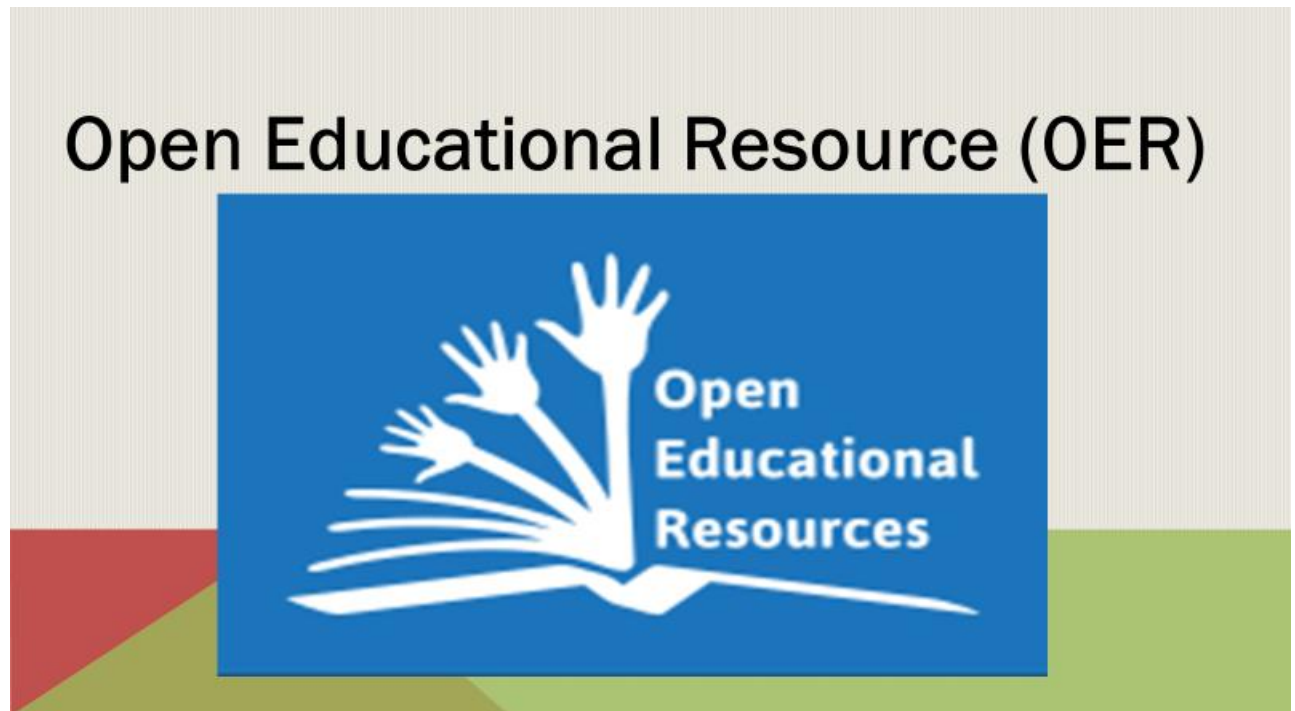
A Seminar on the Topic "Research Methodology: General Guidelines" was held on dated-11.12.2020 in the New Smart Room of the College in two sessions from 11.00 a.m to 5.00 p.m. The Principal Sri Prafulla Chandra Sethi presided over the Inaugural Session which was followed by the first Technical Session. Dr. Jayanta Kar Sharma Associate Professor of Hindi presented a paper in PPT on the Topic "Intellectual Property Rights". He discussed the meaning, origin and types of IPR. He then explained the copy right acts and patents and how to use the resources without its infringement. Students and teachers participated in the Session and raised their queries on different aspects of the topic. Some teachers also added some more inputs to the existing topic. The Session ended with a Vote of thanks by Dr. Jiten Kumar Mishra, Associate Professor of Physics.

The Second Technical Session started after the lunch at 2.30 p.m. Dr. U.S Dash, Associate Professor of Economics presented his paper on "Ethics in Research: Emerging Issues". He talked about the concepts of ethics in the Research Methodology and stressed the importance of honesty, integrity, objectivity, openness and confidentiality in conducting the research programme. He also talked about honoring the copyrights of the authors by following the established procedures. He explained different forms of plagiarism and measures to maintain ethical standard. In this connection software Urkund in detecting plagiarism was discussed. Nearly seventy participants attended the second technical session. Various questions were raised by the students which were answered by the Resource Person. The meeting finally ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Subash Chandra Sahu, Asst. Prof. Chemistry.

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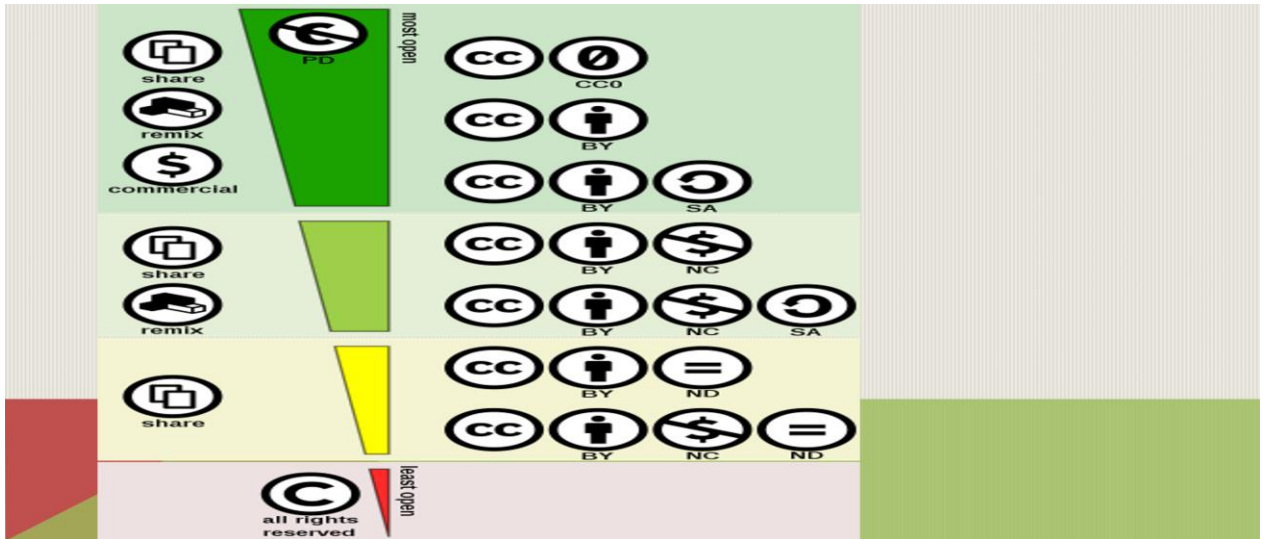

The original non-localized Creative Commons licenses were written with the U.S. legal system in mind, therefore, the wording may be incompatible with local legislation in other jurisdictions, rendering the licenses unenforceable there. To address this issue, Creative Commons asked its affiliates to translate the various licenses to reflect local laws in a process called "porting".^[29] As of July 2011, Creative Commons licenses have been ported to over 50 jurisdictions worldwide.^[30]

The latest version 4.0 of the Creative Commons licenses, released on November 25, 2013, are generic licenses that are applicable to most jurisdictions and do not usually require

What is “Intellectual Property”?

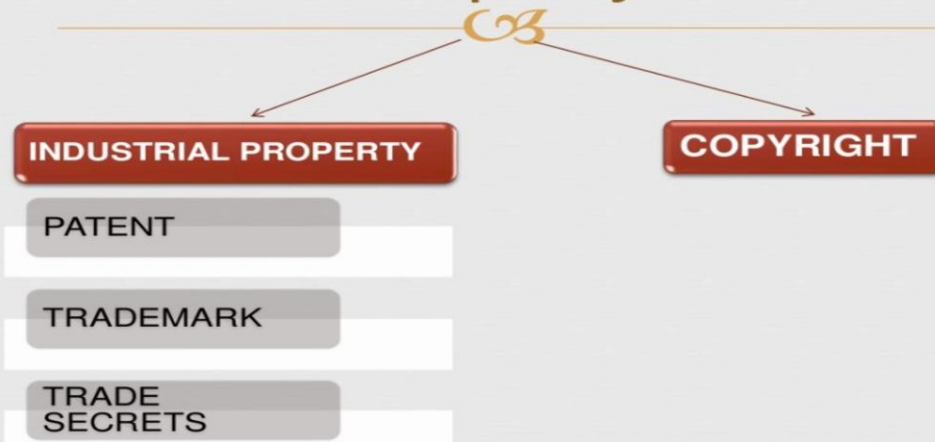
- Intellectual Property is a property that arises from the human intellect. It is a product of human creation.
- Intellectual Property comprises 2 distinct forms:
 - * Literary & Artistic Works
 - * Industrial Property

WIPO



- WIPO (World Intellectual Property Organization) was established by the WIPO Convention in 1967
- The WIPO is a **specialized agency** of the United Nations.
- It **promote the protection** of IP throughout the world.
- Its headquarters are in Geneva, Switzerland

Types of Intellectual Property



What do you need to know about Copyrights?

- ☞ Governed by the Copyright Act 1957. Valid from **21 January 1958**
- ☞ Introduced **civil and criminal remedies** against infringement
- ☞ **Term of copyright** depends on nature of work/owner of copyright and whether the work has been published

What is Copyright?

“The exclusive right given by law for a certain term of years to an author, composer etc. (or his assignee) to print, publish and sell copies of his original work”
(Oxford English Dictionary)



“Literary & Artistic Works”

* They are books, paintings, musical compositions, plays, movies, radio/tv programs, performances, & other artistic works.

❖ How are they Protected?

* Protected by “**COPYRIGHT**”

Duration of Copyright



Copyright lasts for the-

- Author's lifetime + 50 years from the end of the calendar year in which the author dies,
- 50 years for films and sound recordings,
- 25 years for typographical arrangements of a published edition,
- Copyright protection always expires on December 31 of the last calendar year of protection.

Copyright

- The **Indian Copyright Act, 1957** governs the system of copyrights in **India**.
[Amended in 1982, 1984, 1992, 1994 & 1999]
- **Meaning** : It is a right which Grants protection to the unique expression of Ideas.

How much can I use?

- Photos and images - up to 5 works from one author; up to 10% or 15 works, whichever is less, from a collection
- Database information - up to 10% or 2500 fields or cell entries, whichever is less

Remedies for Copyright Infringement



- A **suit** can lie in the district court or in a high court u/s 63 of the copyright act, 1957
- Punishable with imprisonment upto **3 years** and fined as per the claims.

What constitutes Infringement?

- Any reproduction, use, distribution, performance, etc. of the work without the permission of the owner.
- An **identical or substantial similar** reproduction is also covered
- Infringement – Damages - Injunction

PATENTS

- (1) It is covered under the Act called the Patents Act, 1970 [Amended by Patents Act, 2005]
- (2) It extends to the whole of India.
- (3) It shall come into force on such date as the Central Government may publish, by notification in the Official Gazette.

ETHICS IN RESEARCH : EMERGING ISSUES

Four Tenets of Research

- ① Honesty : to convey information truthfully
- ② Accuracy: To make it error free
- ③ Efficiency: optimal use of time and resource
- ④ Objectivity: to have a scientific attitude without any personal prejudices

How to judge ethical standard

- ① Deontology: Judge ethical issues on the basis of universal principles
- ② Ethical skepticism: Individual value judgement are given primary importance
- ③ Utilitarianism : Judgement should depend upon its benefits and costs.

Ethical guidelines

- ① Honesty in reporting data, results, methods and procedures
- ① Objectivity to avoid bias in design, analysis and interpretation of data
- ① Avoid errors on all possible fronts
- ① Openness to intellectual criticism
- ① Respect to IPR such as patents, copyrights etc.
- ① Publication for the benefit of society

Plagiarism in Research Methodology

- What is plagiarism?

Representation of another author's language, thoughts, ideas as one's original work.

Unethical Research practice

Leads to wastage of time, resource and duplication of work efforts.

It is academic dishonesty which affects the work /right of the original author.

Different forms of plagiarism

- ⦿ Submitting someone's work as one's own.
- ⦿ Self-plagiarism
- ⦿ Rewriting other's work without quoting the source
- ⦿ Using quotations without citing the source
- ⦿ Mixing the cited and un-cited sections
- ⦿ Inaccurately citing a source

How to reduce Plagiarism (ICQP strategy)

- Identification: break the sequence
- Citation: Properly cite the source
- Quotation: Quote properly
- Paraphrasing: reframe the sentence, replace words etc.
